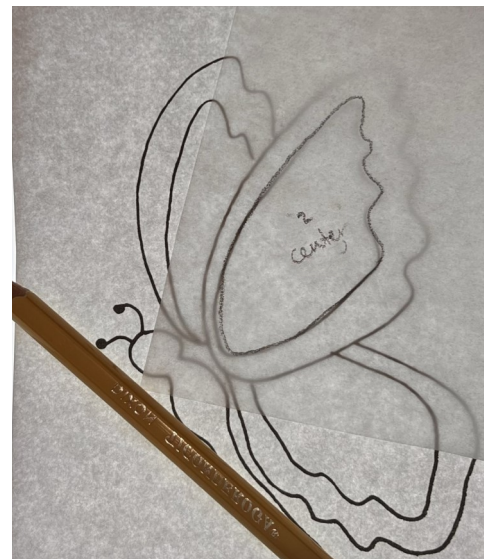


**Butterfly option for Summer Dragonfly wall hanging. Free for your personal use.**

If you have a kit, the dragonfly body fabric will work for the butterfly body. But the wing fabrics will be too small, so you will have to come up with your own fabrics. If this is popular, I may eventually change the kit.

1. Trace each piece separately onto the paper side of fusible web. Make sure it is facing the opposite way of how you want it to end up. It helps to add a bit extra on pieces that will be tucked under another piece.



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2. Cut out roughly, snip for easier paper removal, fuse to the back of appropriate fabrics.



3. Cut out on lines, arrange pieces either on your background, or, my preference, on a pressing sheet. This can be placed over your pattern so you can see where they go. If you use a light table, you can even see the inner lines through the first layer of fabric.



After it cools, you can peel off the whole butterfly, fuse it to your project, and add stitching.
